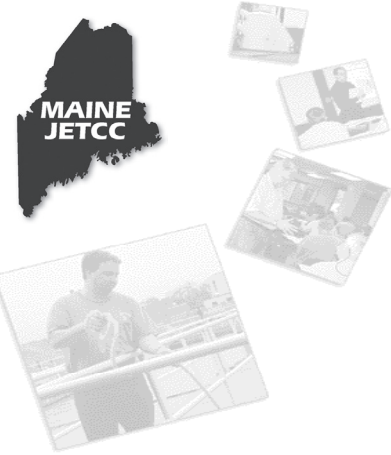

There are many challenges to consider when operating a water or wastewater facility in a climate where ice, cold, and extreme winter weather come with the territory. The key is to be ready ahead of time, and not wait until disaster strikes. By taking the proper steps, you will never have to say "If only I knew then what I know now..."

This interactive session will broaden your awareness of preparedness and preventive maintenance measures that can be taken to ensure effective management of an operation during a "big chill." Experts in the field will explain what they've learned from mishaps experienced or averted. We will discuss operational issues including the biological effects that happen in winter and snowmaking as a method of effluent disposal. The presenters will also examine less well-known safety issues that should be considered when running a water or wastewater plant in Maine's winter. Learn how to protect your facility, your infrastructure, and yourself through foresight, common sense, and creative thinking.

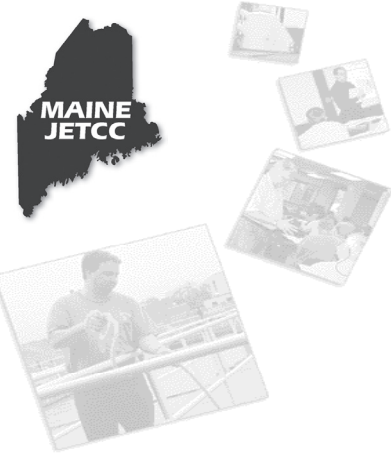

This one-and-a-half day course provides WWTP personnel with the opportunity to learn the laboratory tests for NPDES permitting and plant operations. It prepares participants for the optional NEWEA Voluntary Laboratory Analyst Certification Exam that takes place after the course. Topics to be covered include proper sampling techniques; analyses, meter calibrations, and general QA for pH; total residual chlorine; total suspended solids; biochemical oxygen demand; E-coli; total phosphorous and turbidity; secondary treatment processes; lab management; and chemical hygiene.

Students must bring a basic calculator.

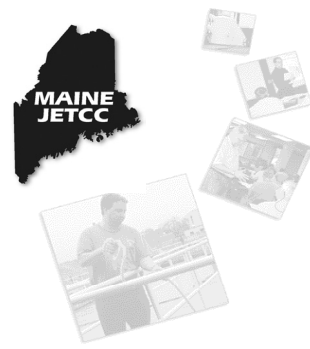

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Process Control for Activated Sludge

The successful operation of an activated sludge wastewater system depends on the ability of the operator to create and maintain an environment where the microorganisms (bugs) do the best possible job of removing pollutants from the water. There are many factors that affect the bugs, some of which the operator can control and some of which he/she cannot. This class will discuss the factors that the operator can control and how those factors affect the treatment process. We will also discuss the process control tests, including sludge settleability, sludge concentration, oxygen uptake, microscopic examination, and clarifier blanket depth that can help the operator know the quality and quantity of activated sludge in the system and help him/her adjust the process for maximum efficiency.

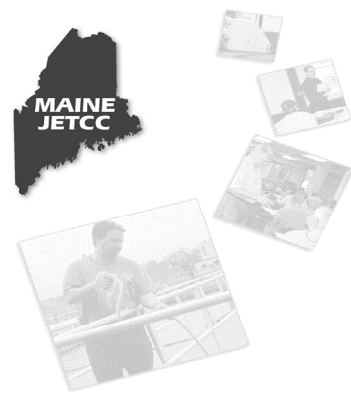

The presence of fats, oils, and grease (FOG) in a wastewater collection system and the treatment process presents many challenges for plant operators. Not only is FOG a headache for operators, but it can also be a challenge for restaurants, schools, and industries that generate it. And then, who regulates FOG and where does it go?

Grease trap design, inspection, and grease removal is regulated, but while Subsurface Wastewater Disposal Rules (SSWD) set standards for businesses, Maine DEP and insurers require operation and maintenance plans for municipalities and treatment facilities. Also some communities rely on a Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) to inspect and enforce, while others may rely on a Licensed Plumbing Inspector (LPI), wastewater treatment plant operator, or public works official.

This course includes a classroom session and a field trip that will teach you what to expect and how to comply with regulations. Learn from some of Maine's seasonal communities that have implemented successful FOG and collection system management plans.
